**(1) GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES;
(2) RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS; AND
(3) NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM which include (i) the grant of the Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate; (ii) the re-election of Directors; and (iii) the notice for convening the AGM.

GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

An ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be granted a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all the powers of the Company to repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution at the AGM.

Assuming no further Shares are issued and repurchased prior to the AGM and based on the issued share capital of the Company of 523,184,390 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company would be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 52,318,439 Shares under the Repurchase Mandate.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules in connection with the proposed general mandate to repurchase Shares is set out in Appendix I to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolutions at the AGM.

GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

An ordinary resolution will also be proposed that the Directors be granted a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all the powers of the Company to allot, issue and deal with new Shares of up to a maximum of 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution at the AGM.

Assuming no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the AGM and based on the issued share capital of the Company of 523,184,390 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company would be allowed to allot and issue a maximum of 104,636,878 Shares under the Issue Mandate.

In addition, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM adding any Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate to the Issue Mandate. The Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate would continue to be in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company unless it is renewed at such meeting or until revoked or varied by ordinary resolutions of the Shareholders in a general meeting held prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Board consists of five Directors, namely, Mr. Wong Siu Keung Joe (“**Mr. Wong**”), Ms. Chu Yin Yin Georgiana (“**Ms. Chu**”), Mr. Chiu Wai On (“**Mr. Chiu**”), Mr. Man Kwok Leung and Mr. To Chun Wai.

According to Bye-law 86(2) of the Bye-laws, any Director appointed to fill a causal vacancy on the Board shall hold office until the next following general meeting of the Company and any Director appointed as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

According to Bye-law 87 of the Bye-laws, at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at least once every three years. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election and shall continue to act as a Director throughout the meeting at which he retires.

According to the above provisions, Mr. Wong, Ms. Chu and Mr. Chiu will retire from office as Directors at the AGM and all retiring Directors are eligible and will offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Each of the independent non-executive Directors has made a confirmation of independence pursuant to the independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules.

The nomination committee of the Company (the “**Nomination Committee**”) has reviewed the biographies of each of the retiring Directors who will be subject to retirement and re-election at the AGM (the “**Retiring Directors**”), and taking into consideration their knowledge, experience, capability and various diversity aspects as set out in the board diversity policy of the Company as well as their overall contributions and services to the Company of the Retiring Directors including his attendance of Board/general meetings and the level of participation and performance on the Board.

The Nomination Committee also considered the independence of the independent non-executive Directors. Mr. Chiu has served the Company as an independent non-executive Director for more than nine years during which period of Mr. Chiu provided professional advice and insight to the Board with his respective extensive experience and knowledge in the accounting and legal aspects. Mr. Chiu has in-depth understanding of the Group’s business and operation and has also demonstrated strong independence by providing comments at Board and Board committee meetings during his tenure of office. In addition, Mr. Chiu does not have any financial or family relationships with any other Directors, senior management, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company, which could give rise to a conflict of interests situation or otherwise affect his exercise of independent judgement. In view of the aforesaid factors, the Nomination Committee considered that long service of Mr. Chiu would not affect his exercise of independent judgment and was satisfied that Mr. Chiu has the required integrity and experience to continue fulfilling the role of an independent non-executive Director. The Nomination Committee affirmed that the independent non-executive Directors remain independent and is of the view that the Retiring Directors will continue to contribute to the Board with their respective perspectives, skills and experience.

Taking into consideration of the above, the Board is of the view that Mr. Chiu remains committed to the role as independent non-executive Director and will continue to be independent. The Board also accepted the nomination by the Nomination Committee and recommended all of the Retiring Directors to stand for re-election by the Shareholders at the AGM.

In accordance with the Corporate Governance Code as set out in the Listing Rules, the re-election of Mr. Chiu will be subject to a separate resolution to be approved at the AGM.

Brief biographical details of Mr. Wong, Ms. Chu and Mr. Chiu are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

CLOSURE OF REGISTER OF MEMBERS

For determining the entitlement to attend and vote at the AGM

The AGM is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, 3 December 2024. For determining the entitlement to attend and vote at the AGM, the register of members of the Company will be closed from Thursday, 28 November 2024 to Tuesday, 3 December 2024, both days inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered. In order to be eligible to attend and vote at the AGM, unregistered holders of Shares should ensure that all the share transfer documents accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the branch share registrar of the Company in Hong Kong, Tricor Tengis Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong, for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, 27 November 2024.

AGM

Notice of the AGM is set out in Appendix III to this circular. A proxy form for appointing proxy is despatched with this circular and published on the website of the Stock Exchange (www.hkex.com.hk). Whether or not you are able to attend the AGM in person, you are requested to complete the proxy form and return it to the branch share registrar and transfer office of the Company in Hong Kong, Tricor Tengis Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong as soon as possible but in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the AGM or the adjourned meeting. Completion and return of a proxy form will not preclude you from attending and voting at the meeting in person or at any adjournment thereof should you so wish.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, the resolutions set out in the notice of the AGM will be put to the vote by way of a poll.

To the best of the Directors' knowledge, information and belief having made all reasonable enquiries, no Shareholder has a material interest that is required to abstain from voting on any of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the proposed (i) granting of the general mandates to the Directors to repurchase Shares and to issue new Shares and adding any Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate to the Issue Mandate (including the extended mandate stipulated under the ordinary resolution set out in paragraph C of item 4); and (ii) the re-election of Directors are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders. The Directors therefore recommend the Shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by Rule 10.06 of the Listing Rules, to provide certain information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there was a total of 523,184,390 Shares in issue.

Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the approval of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 52,318,439 Shares.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to seek a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate shall be funded out of funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda. Under Bermuda law, repurchased shares will be cancelled and the Company's issued share capital will be reduced by the nominal value of the repurchased shares accordingly. However, the aggregate amount of the Company's authorised capital will not be reduced.

4. GENERAL

With effect from 11 June 2024, the Listing Rules are amended pursuant to the "Consultation Conclusions on Proposed Amendments to Listing Rules Relating to Treasury Shares" published by the Stock Exchange on 12 April 2024 (the "**Rule Amendment**"). Following the Rule Amendment, if the Company repurchases Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, the Company will either (i) cancel the repurchased Shares and/or (ii) hold such Shares in treasury, subject to market conditions and the capital management needs of the Company at the relevant time such repurchases of Shares are made.

For any treasury shares (the "**Treasury Shares**") deposited with Hong Kong Securities Clearing Company Limited ("**CCASS**") pending resale on the Stock Exchange, the Company shall (i) procure its broker not to give any instructions to HKSCC to vote at general meetings of the Company for the Treasury Shares deposited with CCASS; and (ii) in the case of dividends or distributions, withdraw the Treasury Shares from CCASS, and either re-register them in its own name as Treasury Shares or cancel them, in each case before the record date for the dividends or distributions; or take any other measures to ensure that it will not exercise any shareholders' rights or receive any entitlements which would otherwise be suspended under the applicable laws if those Shares were registered in its own name as Treasury Shares.

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2024) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

In addition, the Company has confirmed that neither the Explanatory Statement nor the proposed share repurchase has any unusual features.

6. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will only exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

None of the Directors, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, nor any of their respective close associates, has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) that such a person has a present intention to sell, or has undertaken not to sell, any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

7. TAKEOVERS CODE

In the event that the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, so far as the Directors are aware, the following Shareholder had interests in 5% or more of the issued share capital of the Company:

In the event that any exercise of the Repurchase Mandate would, to the knowledge of the Directors, have such a consequence, the Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would trigger a mandatory offer obligation for any Shareholder or group of Shareholders.

The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would result in the amount of Shares held by the public being reduced to less than 25% of the total issued shares of the Company.

8. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

In the six months immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had not repurchased Shares, whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

Mr. Wong Siu Keung Joe

Mr. Wong Siu Keung Joe (“**Mr. Wong**”), aged 59, has been appointed as an executive Director since March 2022. Mr. Wong has been appointed as the company secretary, the authorised representative and the chief financial officer of the Company on 10 January 2022. He is also the chairman of the investment committee. Mr. Wong holds a Degree of Master of Arts in International Accounting from City University of Hong Kong and a Master’s Degree of Corporate Governance from Hong Kong Polytechnic University. He is an associate member of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and a fellow member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants. Mr. Wong has extensive experience in taxation, accounting, financing, audit field and public listed companies for many years. Mr. Wong is currently an independent non-executive director (the “**INED**”) of China Water Industry Group Limited (stock code: 1129) and Affluent Partners Holdings Limited (stock code: 1466), both companies whose shares are listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange. Mr. Wong is also an INED of Hang Tai Yue Group Holdings Limited (stock code: 8081) and an INED of Worldgate Global Logistics Ltd (stock code: 8292) from June 2016 to June 2023, both companies are listed on the GEM of the Stock Exchange.

Mr. Wong is appointed by way of a letter of appointment with no fixed terms but will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election pursuant to the Bye-laws. Mr. Wong is entitled to receive a director’s fee of HK\$65,000 per month from the Company which is determined by the Board with reference to the prevailing market conditions, his duties and responsibilities with the Company.

INDEPENDENT NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

Ms. Chu Yin Yin Georgiana

Ms. Chu Yin Yin Georgiana (“**Ms. Chu**”), aged 54, has been appointed as a non-executive Director since March 2024. Ms. Chu, is also the member of the investment committee. She is an executive Director, Company Secretary and Financial Controller as well as a member of Investment Committee of the China Water Industry Group Limited (stock code: 1129) which is listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange. Ms. Chu holds a Bachelor’s Degree of Accounting and a Master’s Degree of Corporate Governance. She is a fellow member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Association of the Chartered Certified Accountants and the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales. Ms. Chu is a fellow member of both of The Hong Kong Chartered Governance Institute and The Chartered Governance Institute. Ms. Chu has over 20 years’ extensive experience by working in an international audit firm and other listed companies.

Ms. Chu is appointed by way of a letter of appointment with no fixed terms but will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election pursuant to the Bye-laws. She is entitled to an annual director's fee of HK\$180,000 which was determined on the basis of her previous experience, professional qualifications as well as the current financial position of the Company and the prevailing market conditions.

Mr. Chiu Wai On

Mr. Chiu Wai On (“**Mr. Chiu**”), aged 54, has been appointed as an independent non-executive Director since June 2009. Mr. Chiu is also the chairman of each of the audit committee, remuneration committee and nomination committee of the Company. He is a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and a fellow member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants. Mr. Chiu possesses over 10 years of professional experience in accounting and auditing services. Mr. Chiu is also an independent non-executive director of New Times Energy Corporation Limited (stock code: 166), a company listed on the Stock Exchange.

Mr. Chiu is appointed by way of a letter of appointment with no fixed terms but will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election pursuant to the Bye-laws. He is entitled to an annual director's fee of HK\$180,000 which was determined on the basis of his previous experience, professional qualifications as well as the current financial position of the Company and the prevailing market conditions.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, each of Mr. Wong, Ms. Chu and Mr. Chiu does not have, and is not deemed to have, any interest or short positions in any shares, underlying shares or debentures of the Company or any of its associated corporations which is required to be disclosed under Part XV of the SFO and, save as disclosed above, does not have other relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company (within the meaning of the Listing Rules). Save as disclosed above, each of Mr. Wong, Ms. Chu and Mr. Chiu has not held any other directorship in the last three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas or any other position with the Company and other members of the Group.

Save as disclosed above, there is no other matter in connection with the proposed re-election of Mr. Wong, Ms. Chu and Mr. Chiu that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders and there is no other information that should be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

As special businesses, to consider and, if thought fit, pass with or without amendments, the following resolutions as ordinary resolutions:

4. A. “**THAT:**
 - (a) subject to paragraph (c) of this resolution, the exercise by the Directors during the Relevant Period (as hereinafter defined) of all the powers of the Company to allot, issue and deal with the additional shares of HK\$0.05 each in the capital of the Company (the “**Shares**”) or securities convertible into Shares, or options, warrants or similar rights to subscribe for any Shares, and to make or grant offers, agreements, and options which would or might require the exercise of such powers, be and is hereby generally and unconditionally approved;

 - (4) the exercise of options granted under the share option schemes of the Company adopted from time to time in accordance with The Rules (the “**Listing Rules**”) Governing the Listing of Securities on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the “**Stock Exchange**”);
 - (5) the exercise of any conversion rights attaching to any convertible notes issued or to be issued by the Company; and
 - (6) a specified authority granted by the shareholders of the Company in general meeting;

shall not exceed 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of the passing of this resolution, and the approval granted in paragraph (a) of this resolution shall be limited accordingly; and

- (d) for the purpose of this resolution, “**Relevant Period**” means the period from the date of passing of this resolution until whichever is the earliest of:
- (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
 - (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the bye-laws of the Company or any applicable laws to be held; or
 - (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given under this resolution by an ordinary resolution of the shareholders of the Company in general meeting; and

“**Rights Issue**” means an offer of Shares, or an offer or issue of warrants, options or other securities giving rights to subscribe for Shares, open for a period fixed by the Directors to the shareholders of the Company whose names appear on the register of members of the Company on a fixed record date in proportion to their then holdings of such Shares as at that date (subject to such exclusions or other arrangements as the Directors may deem necessary or expedient in relation to fractional entitlements or having regard to any restrictions or obligations under the laws of, or the requirements of any recognised regulatory body or any stock exchange in, any territory outside Hong Kong applicable to the Company).”

B. “**THAT:**

- (a) subject to paragraph (b) of this resolution, the exercise by the Directors during the Relevant Period (as hereinafter defined) of all the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange or on any other stock exchanges on which the shares of the Company may be listed and recognised by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong and the Stock Exchange for this purpose (“**Recognised Stock Exchange**”), subject to and in accordance with all applicable laws and the requirements of the Listing Rules or those of any other Recognised Stock Exchange as amended from time to time, be and is hereby generally and unconditionally approved;
- (b) the aggregate nominal amount of Shares which the Company is authorised to repurchase pursuant to the approval granted in paragraph (a) of this resolution during the Relevant Period (as hereinafter defined) shall not exceed 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of the passing of this resolution, and the approval granted under paragraph (a) of this resolution shall be limited accordingly; and

- (c) for the purpose of this resolution, “**Relevant Period**” means the period from the date of passing of this resolution until whichever is the earliest of:
- (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
 - (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the bye-laws of the Company or any applicable laws to be held; or
 - (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given under this resolution by an ordinary resolution of the shareholders of the Company in general meeting.”
- C. “**THAT** conditional upon the passing of the resolutions set out in paragraphs A and B of item 4 in the notice convening this meeting, the general mandate granted to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with Shares or securities convertible into Shares, or options, warrants or similar rights to subscribe for any Shares, and to make or grant offers, agreements, and options which would or might require the exercise of such powers, pursuant to resolution set out in paragraph A of item 4 above be and is hereby extended by the addition to the aggregate nominal amount of share capital of the Company which may be allotted or agreed conditionally or unconditionally to be allotted by the Directors pursuant to such general mandate, an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company repurchased by the Company under the authority granted pursuant to resolution set out in paragraph B of item 4 above provided that such amount shall not exceed 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing of this resolution.”

Notes:

1. Any member of the Company entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting shall be entitled to appoint another person as his proxy to attend and vote instead of him.
