PROPOSALS FOR GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES, GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES, RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to, inter alia, (i) the granting to the Directors of a general mandate to issue Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of passing the resolution at the AGM; (ii) the granting to the Directors of a general mandate to exercise all the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the

resolution at the AGM; (iii) the extension of the Issue Mandate by those Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate granted to the Directors; and (iv) the reelection of Directors.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

The general mandates to issue and repurchase Shares were last granted by the Shareholders to the then Directors at the annual general meeting of the Company held on 26 September 2014 will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. Ordinary resolutions therefore will be proposed at the AGM to renew the general mandates so as to give Directors general authority:

- (a) to grant the General Mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot and issue Shares with an aggregate nominal value not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal value of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution. Based on the 2,144,421,760 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming that no further Shares are issued prior to the Annual General Meeting, subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolution to approve the General Mandate at the Annual General Meeting, the Directors will be authorized to allot and issue up to a limit of 428,884,352 Shares under the General Mandate. - (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase issued Shares subject to the criteria set out in this circular. Under such Repurchase Mandate, the maximum number of Shares that the Company may repurchase shall not exceed 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue is 2,144,421,760 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed ordinary resolution approving the granting of the Repurchase Mandate and no further Shares are issued prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 214,442,176 Shares, being 10% of the entire issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution in relation thereof. The Repurchase Mandate will end on the earliest of the date of the next annual general meeting, the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by the Articles of Association or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders at a general meeting of the Company; and
- (c) subject to the passing of the aforesaid ordinary resolutions of the General Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate, to extend the number of Shares to be issued and allotted under the General Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

The Board currently comprises seven Directors, namely, Mr. Wang Liang, Dr. Feng Xiaogang, Mr. Zhang Jack Jiyei, Mr. Zhang Bao Yuan, Mr. Yau Yan Ming, Raymond, Mr. Lau Yu and Mr. Zheng Chunlei.

Details of the Directors proposed for re-election at the AGM are set out in the Appendix II to this circular.

Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof, should you so wish.

No Shareholder is required to abstain for voting on the resolutions regarding (i) the granting to the Directors of a general mandate to issue Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of passing the resolution at the AGM; (ii) the granting to the Directors of a general mandate to exercise all the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution at the AGM; (iii) the extension of the Issue Mandate by those Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate granted to the Directors; and (iv) the re-election of Directors.

This is an explanatory statement given to all Shareholders relating to a resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for approving the Repurchase Mandate. This explanatory statement contains all the information required pursuant to Rule 10.06(1)(b) and other relevant provisions of the Listing Rules which is set out as follows:

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there was a total of 2,144,421,760 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued during the period from the Latest Practicable Date to the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 214,442,176 Shares, being 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the relevant resolution at the Annual General Meeting.

2. REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

The Directors have no present intention to repurchase any Shares but consider that the ability to do so would give the Company additional flexibility that would be beneficial to the Company and the Shareholders as such repurchase may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets value of the Company and/or its earning per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

The Company is empowered by its memorandum and articles of association to repurchase its Shares. In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its memorandum and articles of association and laws of the Cayman Islands. The laws of the Cayman Islands and the Articles of Association provide that payment for a share repurchase may only be made out of profits or the proceeds of a new issue of shares made for such purpose, the Company's share premium account or subject to the Companies Law, out of capital of the Company. The amount of premium payable on repurchase of shares may only be paid out of either the profits or out of the share premium account of the Company or subject to the Companies Law, out of capital of the Company.

In addition, under the laws of the Cayman Islands, payment out of capital by a company for the purchase by a company of its own shares is unlawful unless immediately following the date on which the payment is proposed to be made, the Company shall be able to pay its debts as they fall due in the ordinary course of business. In accordance with the laws of the Cayman Islands, the shares so repurchased may be treated as cancelled or held as treasury shares but, if cancelled, the aggregate amount of authorised share capital will not be reduced. Under the Listing Rules, all repurchased shares are required to be cancelled.

As compared with the financial position of the Company as at 31 March 2015 (as disclosed in its latest audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2015), the Directors consider that in the event that the proposed repurchase were to be carried out in full during the proposed repurchase period, there would be material adverse impact on the working

capital and on the gearing position of the Company. The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing ratio of the Company.

4. DIRECTORS, THEIR ASSOCIATES AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and belief having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates, has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is granted by the Shareholders.

No connected person of the Company (as defined in the Listing Rules) has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company nor has he/she/it undertaken not to sell any of the Shares held by him/her/it to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is granted by the Shareholders.

5. UNDERTAKING OF THE DIRECTORS

6. EFFECT OF TAKEOVERS CODE

If on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Cherrie Holdings Limited and its associates were Substantial Shareholder of the Company (as defined under Listing Rules), which were interested in approximately 14.20% of the issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, the aggregate percentage shareholdings of Cherrie Holdings Limited and his associates would increase to approximately 15.78%. The Directors are not aware of any consequences which may arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchase made under the Repurchase Mandate.

The Directors will not exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that the number of Shares held by the public would fall below 25% of the total number of Shares in issue as a result of such repurchase.

He is entitled to a remuneration of HK\$20,000 per month and a discretionary bonus as determined at the sole discretion of the Board with reference to his duties and level of responsibilities, the remuneration policy of the Company and the prevailing market conditions. The directorship of Mr. Zheng with the Company will be subject to rotation requirements and re-election pursuant to the Articles.
